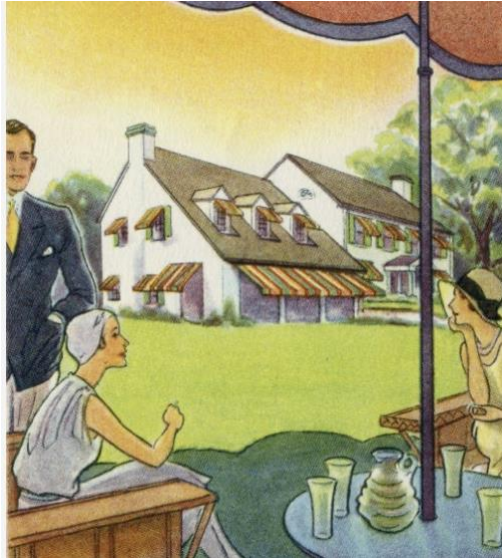




Parish Picnic
