Prelude: Fade, Fade Each Earthly Joy Theodore E. Perkins (1831-1912)

Communion: Medley: Jesus, I my Cross Have Taken / More about Jesus arr. Harold DeCou

The hymn, 'Jesus, I my Cross Have Taken', was written by the English poet and Anglican clergyman, Henry Francis Lyte (1793-1847). It was first published in 1824 and is most commonly sung to this tune, Ellesdie, played here today, which is attributed to W. A. Mozart. The hymn, 'More about Jesus', was written by Eliza E. Hewitt in 1887. It is a prayer expressing a deep desire to know Christ and reflect His love.
